The goal of palliative care is to improve quality of life for both the patient and their family. Palliative care is provided by a team of doctors, nurses and other specialists who work with a patient's medical team to provide extra support for the patient and their family.

The publication, Palliative Medicine in the UK c.1970–2010, looks at the development of the field of palliative medicine and the growth of the specialty. It focuses on palliative medicine and the modern hospice movement developed in the UK from the late 1960s. The book includes the history of the first modern hospice, St Christopher's Hospice founded by Dame Cicely Saunders, which combined palliative medicine with clinical research and teaching.

### History of palliative medicine in the UK - ehospice

Palliative medicine had 298 consultants and 181 specialty registrars in England (NHS Digital, 2016). Women make up 73% of the consultant workforce, and 88% of the higher specialty trainees in the UK (2014/15 RCP census, 2016). Across the UK, almost as many consultants are employed by the charitable sector as by the NHS.

The Specialty Certificate Examination (SCE) in Palliative Medicine is delivered once a year. Eligibility requirements.
